ADAMS COUNTY

In 1901 the Colorado Legislature authorized the creation of the City and County of Denver. That action took place on March 18, 1901. Denver was carved from the western end of Arapahoe County and within a month Arapahoe County had been reduced from the long rectangle that had reached all the way to the Kansas Border to its present boundaries. The eastern portion was divided and added to Washington and Yuma Counties. The western portion was divided longitudinally and on April 15, 1901 the Legislature approved the creation of Adams County. Brighton was designated the county seat and has so remained.

Adams County is a long, narrow, east-west oriented rectangle. The county is eighteen miles in the north-south dimension and seventy-two miles from east to west. The northern boundary is shared with Weld and Morgan Counties. On the east Washington County borders Adams County. The southern boundary is with Arapahoe County until that common line encounters the eastern edge of the City and County of Denver. The remainder of the southern boundary is a complex and irregular line westward to Jefferson County. The western boundary is shared with Jefferson and Boulder Counties.

The topography of Adams County is gently rolling prairie that rises east and west from the South Platte River and for most of the county from the north to the south. From the South Platte eastward there are a number of streams flowing north. Nearly all of them are intermittent streams, or normally have minimal water flow. However, flash floods do occur and can send dangerous torrents downstream to the South Platte. The most prominent of these streams are Box Elder, Kiowa, Bijou, Muddy and Sand Arroyo Creeks.

Economically Adams County has had a split personality. The western third of the county is a part of the Denver Metropolitan Complex. As such it is highly developed with extensive residential, commercial and industrial districts. The eastern two-thirds of Adams County remain largely agricultural in nature. Ranching predominates but there is agriculture where irrigation is possible. The only active communities are along Interstate 70.


A recent factor that will push development eastward was the construction of the Denver International Airport. Already there are subdivisions rising to the north and east of the airport.

Initial travel through what is now Adams County was along the South Platte River. Soon a secondary trail, the Fort Morgan Cut-Off, developed and diagonally crossed the future Adams County from Fort Morgan to Denver.

In 1870 the Kansas Pacific Railroad entered the area near present day Bennett and paralleled the modern county line to Denver. That railroad is now a part of the Union Pacific system. The western portion of the county has been home to a complicated network of railroads, most of short extent and no longer operating. The active railroads are the Union Pacific routes from Denver to Cheyenne and to Julesburg. The Burlington Northern Railroad also operates track that crosses western Adams County.


The proximity to Denver has made western Adams County a destination for not only railroads but for major highways. US 6, 36 and 40 come from the east and US 85 and 87 come from the north, all bound for Denver. In recent years, Interstates 70 and 76 have assumed much of the load of east-west traffic and Interstate 25 is the principal north-south route. These Interstate corridors are an incentive to increasing development along their courses.

There is a comprehensive network of county roads in eastern Adams County; however, direct eastwest travel is simpler than north-south travel.

ADAMS CITY

On August 27, 1903 the Adams Land and Improvement Company filed a plat for Adams City. This action seems to have been, at least partially, in hope that the new "City" would become the county seat. That was a false hope. Brighton was named the county seat when Adams County was authorized in 1901 and has remained the county seat.

The town and the county were named for Alva Adams who was the governor of Colorado from 1887 to 1889, from 1897 to 1899 and again for sixty days in 1905.

This area, northeast of Denver, grew as an industrial district and continues to be the location of numerous light industries, refineries and other commercial enterprises.

In 1963 much of the area along Brighton Boulevard (US Highway 85) consolidated to form Commerce City. The Adams City Post Office became a branch of the Commerce City Post Office.

In 1999 the Adams City Branch Post Office was located in a small brick building at 6655 Brighton Boulevard.



AURORA

It is not a simple task to straighten out the various statements that have been made concerning the early days of the city we now know as Aurora. A problem is to decide under which county Aurora should be listed in *The Colorado Postal Encyclopedia*. Post Office Department Geographical Site Location Reports and other later documents confirm that the Aurora Post Office has often moved across the county line.

The first site (1908) of the Aurora Post Office was at what is now 1515 Dallas Street. That location, in the Gresham Jones General Store, was just north of Colfax Avenue and thus was in Adams County. A May 28, 1926 Geographical Site Location Report places the post office "50 feet north of the county boundary." That may still reference the 1908 location. By June 1928 the post office was south of Colfax Avenue, in Arapahoe County. The January 1942 Report places it at 1492 Dallas Street, 30 feet south of US Highway 40 (Colfax Avenue).

On January 1, 1940, Aurora had become a Branch of the Denver Post Office. In January 1953 a new building, 50 x 90 feet, was constructed at 16th and Elmira, in Adams County. It appears that the post office was still there on April 28, 1962 when it once again became an independent office. In late 1965 another new post office building was constructed, on Dayton, between Colfax and 16th Avenues. That location is now the Dayton Station of the Aurora Post Office.

Today the Main Aurora Post Office is at 16890 East Alameda Avenue, well within Arapahoe County.

At this point I am making a decision to list Aurora under Adams County, but I will make an appropriate cross-reference under Arapahoe County. This may not be the best choice as in the twenty-first century the major portion of the City of Aurora is in Arapahoe County.

There is general agreement that land developer Donald T. Fletcher founded the community. Initially the community was named "Fletcher" for its developer. It also seems to be accepted that the town of Fletcher was established in 1891 and was incorporated on April 22, 1891. There are reports that place the date of founding in 1881 and the incorporation on May 1, 1891.

1893 brought the downfall of Mr. Fletcher. In two short years he, or the town of Fletcher, had accumulated large debts. The silver crash of that year wiped out Fletcher's finances and he left town, leaving the fledgling community deep in debt to pay for bonds for a non-existent water system. It would be many years before the debts were paid and financial stability was achieved.

There was no post office with the name of Fletcher. For postal services the residents relied on neighboring Montclair.


The name Aurora may have entered the picture even before 1891. One source states that the name of Fletcher's Development was officially changed to "Aurora" when the Colfax Trust Company filed a plat for the area on April 1, 1890. Another source claims that Aurora was incorporated in 1903 to gain some protection from the complex location in Adams and Arapahoe Counties and abutting Denver County.

In 1907 the Town Board officially changed the name from Fletcher to Aurora. Undoubtedly this was a belated reaction to Fletcher and the problems he left for the town.

Aurora is a Latin term meaning, "dawn" or "morning." As the easternmost portion of Metropolitan Denver, it would be the first to see the dawn. Also, one of the largest subdivisions within Fletcher was named Aurora.

In spite of its early problems, Aurora has grown into one of the largest cities in Colorado and it now reaches from approximately Interstate 70 to well south into Douglas County. As a large city it has all of the resources one would expect. There are numerous large business districts and shopping malls, schools, hospitals, the former Fitzsimons Army Medical Center, Buckley Field and an extensive residential area. Aurora continues to expand eastward.

BARR

This community began as "Platte Summit." When the Chicago, Burlington and Quincy Railroad Company laid tracks into the area in 1882-1883 the residents of Platte Summit changed the name of their town to "Barr City" to honor Mr. Barr, the railroad's civil engineer. Although the town carried that name for several years, the post office, when established in 1883, was simply "Barr."

In spite of having a railroad station and being in good farming and ranching country the town was very slow to develop.

By 1899 the "City" had been dropped from the name, but there was a creamery, several saloons, a boarding house and a blacksmith. The post office was in the general store belonging to Joseph A. Williamson, the postmaster.

The Burlington Ditch and Reservoir Company was formed in 1884 and the Burlington Ditch was constructed in 1886. This ditch took water from the South Platte River and stored it in an artificial lake that was constructed just east of Barr City. From there the water was used to irrigate a large area east of Brighton and northeast of Barr. The reservoir was originally named Oasis Lake.

The lake offered another opportunity for Barr City—the development of a recreational and resort facility. In 1887 the Barr City Land Company was formed. On August 5, 1887 W. E. Alexander filed a town plat for Barr. The lake was renamed "Barr Lake" and a hotel was built alongside the lake. The Panic of 1893 hit hard and the resort failed to develop.

In 1903 The Burlington Ditch Company filed an application to enlarge the lake, increasing its capacity fourfold.

In 1907 the town changed its name to "Barr Lake" but it was not until 1914 that the post office name was changed.

To reach the site of Barr (Barr Lake), drive northeast from Denver on Interstate 76 to Exit 21 and go a short distance east on East 136th Avenue into the community of Barr Lake.

BARR LAKE

Barr Lake began life as a tiny community named "Platte Summit." With the arrival of the Chicago, Burlington and Quincy Railroad, Platte Summit became Barr City or simply Barr, named for a civil engineer that helped build the railroad.

In 1887 The Burlington Ditch Company created an artificial lake to the east of Barr. This became known as Barr Lake and by 1914 both the town and the post office had adopted the name of Barr Lake.

1964 newspaper reports indicate that the lake had been contaminated and was in need of reclamation. By 1975 the lake, when full, covered nearly 2,000 acres. In that year it became state property and in 1977 was opened to the public as Barr Lake State Park. The Park has not been extensively developed and today is one of the better bird and wildlife habitats in Colorado.

When I visited Barr Lake in 1999 the small community of Barr Lake was crowded between Interstate 76 and the lake. There were only a few small, unimpressive residences. However, considering its position, only three to four miles southeast of Brighton and on a major highway connection to Denver, development of the area seems a future possibility.



BASHOR

Bashor was a rural post office about fourteen miles east of Brighton. The area was and still is devoted to farming and ranching and there was no organized community.

During its short life Bashor had two postmasters: Gertrude Bashor and Hannah Bashor. Thus, the source of the name for the post office is obvious.

To reach the site of Bashor, drive northeast from Denver on Interstate 76 to Exit 22. Turn east on Bromley Lane (East 152nd Avenue). Go east 10 miles to Quail Run Road. In 1999 the last mile was unpaved but presented no problem. Also, the road sign was spelled "Quial." Turn north and go a mile and a half, passing East 160th Avenue. At that point, you can look west to Horse Creek Reservoir. At the time I was there, there was, from Quail Run Road, some visible evidence that there had been habitation at the edge of the lake. I assume that might be the location of Bashor. It is possible that the actual site of Bashor is now within the reservoir basin.



BENNET / BENNETT

The original settlement here was first known as Kiowa, for nearby Kiowa Creek. In 1877 when the post office was acquired, there was already an active Kiowa Post Office in Colorado, thus another name was required. The new post office took the name of Bennet for Hiram P. Bennett. Whether by error, or for some other reason, the office name was spelled with only one "T" instead of the proper two. This error persisted until 1907 when the spelling was corrected to Bennett. From maps and other documents it appears that the town name was always spelled "Bennett" in spite of what the Post Office Department chose to do.

BENNET / BENNETT- Continued

A town plat for Bennett was filed on May 8, 1911 and the village was incorporated in 1930.

Hiram Pitt Bennett was postmaster of Denver from 1869 to 1874. He had earlier been chosen to be the delegate to Washington representing the unofficial Jefferson Territory. That position disappeared when Western Kansas became Colorado Territory.

There is another claim for the origin of the name. On the night of May 21, 1878 a flash flood washed out the railroad bridge over Kiowa Creek. An engine, tender and eighteen freight cars plunged into the creek. The engineer and fireman were killed. The claim is that the town was "renamed" for the widows of the trainmen, two sisters whose maiden names were Bennett. Another report claims that they were the daughters of Postmaster Bennett. The problem with this tale is that at the time of the flood the Bennet Post Office had already been in operation for over a year.

As Kiowa, the site was a popular stop on the stage route along the Fort Morgan Cut-Off Trail to Denver from Fort Morgan on the South Platte River. With the arrival of the Kansas Pacific Railroad in 1870 the site became a station and shipping point on the railroad. From then on, Bennett began to develop into a small community providing supplies for surrounding ranchers and farmers.

During the twentieth century Bennett continued to grow slowly but as the end of the century approached the growth began to accelerate. The construction of Interstate 70, the construction of the new Denver International Airport and the continuing eastward expansion of the Denver Metropolitan Complex have contributed to turning Bennett into more of a residential community. Bennett still serves ranchers and farmers in eastern Adams and Arapahoe Counties, but new businesses are directed more towards a growing commuter population.

Bennett is at Exit 304 from Interstate 70.





BIRD

Bird was intended to be a post office located on the Kansas Pacific (Union Pacific) Railroad. Its brief history, as found in Post Office Department records, make it seem very likely that it was never in operation.

Based on the Post Office Department Geographic Site Location Report, I place the location on the north side of the railroad and the west side of Chambers Road. In 1998 that area was largely undeveloped, but it is in an area that is being developed for light industrial use.

The Bird Post Office is closely related to the Duff Post Office, which was in the same general area. Please refer to the Duff Post Office for a deeper discussion of the relationship of these two post offices.

The Geographic Site Location Report suggested the name "Birch," which was rejected.

BRIGHTON

In 1879 the name of the Hughes Post Office was changed to Brighton.

Daniel F. Carmichael, a resident of Denver and engaged in real estate, owned a farm at Hughes. He platted the property and the new town was named Brighton. Most sources attribute the selection of the name to Mrs. Carmichael whose hometown was Brighton, Massachusetts. A couple of sources claim her hometown was Brighton Beach, New York.

Brighton was incorporated in 1887 and grew into an important commercial center north of Denver, along the road to Greeley. For many years it was the junction point for the Denver Pacific Railroad and the Denver and Boulder Railroad. It is still on the Union Pacific Railroad from Denver to Cheyenne, but the Denver and Boulder has been gone for many years.

On April 15, 1901 the Colorado Legislature authorized the establishment of Adams County and Brighton was selected as the county seat, a position it still maintains.

Brighton has continued to develop and has become a major commercial center and suburb northeast of Metropolitan Denver.

Brighton is located on US Highway 85, northeast of Denver and just south of the Adams-Weld County Line.

BUNNELL

A little more than two months after it was established, the name of the Camp Speer Post Office was changed to Bunell. I have found no reason for the change in name and it seems an odd choice for a post office that was located within the grounds of a military facility.

The post office operated as Bunell for three years at which time the name was changed again, to Fitzsimons, reflecting that the facility was now known as United States Army Fitzsimons General Hospital.

The location of Bunell was within the hospital grounds, on the north side of Colfax Avenue and east of Peoria Street.



CAMP SPEER

Camp Speer was the first post office to serve the military reservation that would become the Fitzsimons Army Medical Center. The facility was initially known as the United States General Army Hospital Number 21.

After less than three months the name of the post office was for an unknown reason changed to "Bunell." Perhaps Camp Speer was no longer the accepted designation for the Military Reservation.

The location described in the Post Office Department Geographic Site Location Report places the Camp Speer Post Office within the grounds of the Military Reservation.

COMANCHE

Comanche was an early twentieth century rural post office seventeen miles north of Strasburg and a mile south of the Adams-Weld County Line.

It was named for the Comanche Indian Tribe of the southern plains.

Theodore Thaden and his family began a campaign to establish a "full service" farm community in an otherwise sparsely populated area. A combination drug-tobacco-candy store, a grocery store and a post office were built. The venture struggled and eventually the Thaden's gave up on the effort.

The Post Office Department Records raise some questions about the history of the Comanche Post Office. The post office was ordered closed in September 1911. But, a Geographic Site Location Report was filed in early 1914 and postmarks are known from the period of 1912-1915. Thus it appears that the closing order was rescinded and Comanche was in operation from 1911 to 1923. Theodore M. Thaden is the only postmaster of record.

Begin at Strasburg and follow the directions to Living Springs, then continue north on Headlight Road (a total of eighteen miles from Strasburg) to East 160th Avenue. Turn east on East 160th. There is a very old building [1997] just beyond the turn and a half-mile to the east there is an old brick building on the north side of the road.



COMMERCE CITY

In 1910 the Commerce City Post Office began as the Derby Post Office. It was known by that name until 1963 when the name was changed to Commerce City.

Over the years the area developed as an industrial and commercial center with a small residential component. In 1952 a section was incorporated as "Commerce Town." In 1962 Commerce Town annexed a portion of Derby and promoted itself to "Commerce City." Within a year the name of the Derby Post Office had been changed to Commerce City. And, at about the same time, the nearby Adams City Post Office became a Branch of Commerce City.

This descriptively named suburb of Denver is the location of numerous oil refineries, grain elevators and other industrial activities.

In 1999 the Commerce City Post Office was in a modern brick building on the west side of Magnolia Street, just south of East 73rd Avenue. This is the same general area that was described for the Derby Post Office.

DERBLAY

In July 1892 the name of the Washburn Post Office was changed to Derblay. Five months later the change was reversed and the name of the post office remained Washburn until January 1893 when it became Hazeltine. Other than the Post Office Department Records of Postmaster Appointments the historical literature of Colorado is silent on the subject of Derblay.

Unless a move of the post office was involved, and there is no evidence for that, then Derblay was at the same location as Washburn. Stephen W. Brereton being the only postmaster named for both Derblay and Washburn supports the coincidence of location.

The location of Washburn plots in the triangle formed by the modern roads of Interstate 76, US Highway 85 and East 104th Avenue.

DERBY

On November 15, 1889, the Lincoln Land Company filed a plat for Derby. However, it was twenty years before a post office was established at Derby. This seems unusual for the time, as there was no other nearby post office.

The locations of the Derby Post Office were near the railroad. Derby developed as more of an industrial community than a residential town. By the middle of the century the town was focused on light industry, warehouses and other similar businesses. In 1952 that growth prompted a change name to Commerce City to call more attention to the economic base of the town.

Based on the descriptions contained in the Post Office Department Geographic Site Location Reports the Derby Post Office was located in the northwest corner of the intersection of East 72nd Avenue and Monaco Street. There is a small triangle of the described quarter section between the intersection and the tracks of the Burlington Northern Railroad.



DUFF

There is no question that Duff was a post office established on the Kansas Pacific (Union Pacific) Railroad a few miles east of Denver. It is likely that it was little more than a shipping point for the surrounding countryside.

The questions arise when I try to reconcile the various names that have been applied to railroad stations, sidings and post offices along the segment of the railroad between Peoria Street and Tower Road.

The first attempt to establish a post office in this area was in 1880 with the Bird Post Office. That attempt seems to have failed. The next attempt was in 1884 when the Duff Post Office was authorized. It lasted for seven years, was discontinued for seven months and then reestablished, operating for another four years.

According to one report the Duff Post Office was about six miles east of the site of "Sable." Sable was first known as "Schuyler" and the Bird Post Office was established "near the site of Schuyler." 1892 and 1902 maps label the site of Schuyler as "Magnolia." A 1909 map labels it as Sable. G. W. Talmadge filed an undated plat for the town of Sable. The Post Office Department Geographical Site Location Report for Bird describes it as being at the Magnolia Station. The 1884 Report for Duff also places it at the Magnolia Station. However, about two miles separate the Federal Land Survey locations given on those two reports.

When the Duff Post office reopened, it was about a mile and a half east of the original location.

As best I can sort this out, Bird and the original site of Duff were likely at the same location which today is on the west side of Chambers Road and the north side of the railroad. Smith Road parallels the railroad on the south side.

The second location of Duff plots on the east side of Buckley Road and the north side of the railroad.

To complicate things a little bit more, The USGS Topographic Map of Adams County (1976) locates "Sable" a mile to the west of the Bird/Duff location and south of the tracks. The same map also locates a "Magee" near the second location of Duff.

There is one last name to add to the pot: the original Site Location Report for Duff suggested the name "Lustano." That was rejected.

I have found no information that provides an origin for any of these names. It would not be unreasonable to guess that they were the names of railroad officials at some level.

In 1998 the site of Duff was open land, but it is in an area that was being developed for light industry.

DUPONT

The community of Dupont originated in the 1920's when E. I. Du Pont de Nemours & Company constructed storage facilities for explosives manufactured at their plant in Louviers (Douglas County). The town took the name of the Du Pont family and company.

On December 7, 1925 Frank Henebry filed a plat for the town of Dupont. Later, Dupont was adjacent to the Rocky Mountain Arsenal. The Arsenal and the explosives storage facility are no more.

Dupont does continue to exist and is now largely a residential community with some small businesses. Because of the growth of the surrounding communities, Adams City and Commerce City, it is difficult to tell when you have entered Dupont.

In 1999 the Dupont Post Office was in a white, frame building at 8096 Brighton Road.



EASTLAKE

On November 7, 1911 the Eastlake Investment Company filed a townsite plat for Eastlake. The town was in an area that was devoted to farming and ranching. For many years that remained the situation.

The community was named for East Lake, an irrigation reservoir to the east of the town.

As the twentieth century progressed the nearby Denver suburbs, Thornton and Northglenn, continued to grow rapidly, eventually surrounding the Eastlake townsite. In 1990 Eastlake was annexed to Thornton.

Take Interstate 25 north to the exit for 120th Avenue. Drive east one and a half miles to York and turn north and follow the Union Pacific Railroad tracks into the older portion of Eastlake. This street changes names to Claude Court. Old Eastlake is still a small business district with some older homes However the old section has become surrounded by a number of large, fancy, modern subdivisions. The Eastlake Post Office is a short distance north of East 120th Avenue. Formerly the post office was in the business district on First Street.



ESKDALE

Eskdale is briefly described as a rural post office. Once again, a location at the eastern edge of Adams County supports that description. This area is open ranchland with very little sign of modern habitation. Each of the three reported moves of the post office appears related to a change in postmaster - a move from one ranch to another.

I have found no information as to the source of the name Eskdale.

To visit the three sites of Eskdale, you could continue on after the expedition to Oleson, or perhaps start fresh from US Highway 36 on the southern edge of Adams County. From the second side trip to Oleson, at the intersection of East 136th Avenue and Shamrock Road, drive north one mile to East 144th Avenue and turn east four miles to Winnview Road. That intersection would be your marker, coming north fifteen miles from US 36 on Winnview Road.

Two of the sites of Eskdale were south of this intersection and one was to the north. This latter location is questionable.

The original site of Eskdale (1911 & 1914) was two miles to the south and on the east side of Winnview Road (thirteen miles from US 36). There is nothing to be seen at that location, but there are some farm buildings and grain storage bins on the west side of the road.

To observe the 1920 site of Eskdale, drive one mile east on East 144th Avenue from Winnview Road. Then turn south on a poor road, passing a ranch. The site was one mile south of East 144th Avenue and to the southwest of that point - again there is no evidence, other than a clump of trees, for any habitation.

The 1920 Geographical Site Location Report indicates that the 1920 location was "two and threeeighths miles south of a "previous location." That "previous location" would be a mile and a half north of the turn south to the 1920 site. There is no access road and nothing is visible from either Winnview Road or East 144th Avenue.



FITZSIMONS

Fitzsimons was the third name applied to the post office that served United States Army General Hospital Number 21. The hospital was opened in late 1918 on a tract of land on the north side of East Colfax Avenue and east of Peoria Street.

Construction of the hospital was a direct result of the need for medical facilities to serve military personnel wounded in World War I. Ground was broken on April 29, 1918 and construction began on May 2. The hospital was dedicated in October 1918.

After the war, it was decided to continue operation of the hospital and the name was changed to Fitzsimons General Hospital to honor Lieutenant William Thomas Fitzsimons, U. S. Army Medical Corps, who was killed September 4, 1917 in France.

In succeeding years the hospital was frequently enlarged and became one of the premier medical facilities serving army personnel.

At the end of the twentieth century, the Defense Department concluded that the aging hospital was no longer efficient and a decision was made to close the facility.

Almost from the day of its opening, the military felt there was a need for an on site post office to serve the patients at the hospital. Camp Speer was the first name applied to the post office, but that was soon changed to Bunell. The second name lasted for nearly three years before it was changed to the more appropriate Fitzsimons. After two years of independent operation the Fitzsimons Post Office was converted to a Branch of the Denver Post Office.

Until 1942 the post office was located within the hospital grounds. A Site Location Report from January 1942 locates the Fitzsimons Post Office outside the hospital grounds in the area on the west side of Peoria Street and north of Montview Boulevard. Today that area is a mixed residential and business community.

The move from the hospital grounds was likely a consequence of a large influx of casualties from World War II that generated a need for increased space for the postal facility and perhaps a need for the space within the hospital.

At some point the branch post office was moved back within the hospital grounds.

FROST

Frost was another of the several rural/ranch post offices in eastern Adams County. This one was in the extreme northeast corner, one mile south of the Adams-Morgan County Line and one mile west of the Adams-Washington County Line.

The first and only postmaster here was Frank Frost, thus the post office bore his family name.

The Adams-Morgan County Line coincides with East 168th Avenue. One-half mile to the south, East 164th Avenue goes east into the Hough Farms complex, a mile from Winnview Road.

East 164th Avenue is seventeen and one-half miles north of US Highway 36.

FULTON

Fulton was an early rural post office on a portion of the Overland Stage Route that was in use before the Fort Morgan Cut Off came into general use. It was located on the east side of the Platte River a short distance south of present day Henderson. It is shown on an 1866 map, but disappears soon after that.

The location provided by the Post Office Department Geographical Site Location Report is only approximate - somewhere in Section 3. The Site Location Report mentions the "O. K. House," which could have been a hotel of some sort. I suspect that it was along the portion of present day Brighton Boulevard, south of East 120th Avenue.

In 1999 there was one older building in the area, but even it does not date from the 1860's.

GLOBEVILLE

For most of its existence as an independent post office and its subsequent life as a station of the Denver Post Office, Globeville was in what is now the City and County of Denver. For the last two years as an independent Post Office the Geographical Site Location Report places Globeville within the boundaries of Adams County. From that described location, I believe that it was on the west side of Washington Street, immediately south of East 55th Avenue. In 1999 that side of Washington Street was open lots. The easiest access to this site is from The East 58th Avenue Exit from Interstate 25, east to Washington Street and then south on Washington Street to East 55th Avenue.

The community of Globeville was the location for a number of smelters processing ores shipped to Denver from throughout Colorado. The area is still largely industrial in nature with some apartments and low-end housing.

HARRIS

Homesteaders Pleasant DeSpain and Edward Bruce Bowles were the first permanent settlers in this area. Eventually there was a Colorado and Southern Railroad station that took the name of DeSpain Junction. On June 27, 1890 Henry Lowe and T. Hagerman filed a town plat for Harris Park on land owned by a Mr. Harris. Other names briefly applied to this place were Harrisburg and finally Harris, when a post office was granted in 1890.

In 1891 Stanford White of New York organized a Presbyterian College at Harris. It was known as Westminster University. The University closed in 1917, but in 1909 the town was incorporated under the name of Westminster.

Harris developed as a largely residential community that supported the University and served as a supply point for the surrounding area of ranches and farms.

The recent growth of Westminster makes it difficult to identify the original section. The area along West 73rd Avenue seems best to fit the need. In 1999 the Westminster Post Office was on the east side of Meade Street between West 72rd Avenue and West 73rd Avenue.



HAZELTINE

Hazeltine was the final name applied to the post office that was located in the triangle formed by present day East 104th Avenue, US Highway 85 and Interstate 76.

Hazeltine lasted a few more years than its predecessor Washburn and the name still appears on the USGS Topographic Map for Adams County (Sheet 1) although it is spotted about a mile north of the plotted location for the post office. In addition, the area a short distance to the west, around the intersection of East 104th Avenue and Brighton Road, is labeled "Hazeltine Heights."

During the period of its existence there is no evidence that Hazeltine/Washburn was anything more than a railroad post office that served a few nearby farms and ranches.

The area in the described "triangle" contains some light industrial buildings of fairly recent construction.

Stephen Brereton, the first postmaster of Hazeltine was also the only postmaster of Washburn and the short-lived Derblay, which was at the same location.

HENDERSON

On March 1, 1894 the name of the Island Station Post Office was changed to Henderson.

Henderson's Island was named for Captain Jack Henderson who came to the territory in late 1858. He settled on a parcel of land in the South Platte River valley and established the first feed yard and public corral in the region. The community that grew up along the riverbank took the name Henderson.

Henderson was one of several small communities between Brighton and Denver that served as supply points for nearby ranches and farms. In recent years, although these communities still exist, they are blending more and more into the growing Denver Metropolitan area. That means constant changes in roads and the removal or extensive remodeling of the older buildings.

From Brighton, drive southwest on Brighton Road. This was the old US Highway 85 before construction of the modern four-lane US 85 along the Union Pacific Railroad.

The Henderson Post Office has had at least two distinct locations. For most of its existence, it has been on today's Brighton Road, south of East 124th Avenue. In 1999 the Henderson Post Office was in a small brick building on the east side of Brighton Road.

The Geographic Site Location Report filed in 1914 places the Henderson Post Office a mile to the east of Brighton Road. The stated location would be east of modern US 85 and the Union Pacific Railroad. From Brighton Road go east on East 124th Avenue, cross to the east side of the railroad and turn south on Oakland Street. The Site Location Report placed the post office 400 feet east of the railroad. That would fit a location on Oakland street and, in 1999 there was an old building that gave the appearance of having once been a store and perhaps a location for the Henderson Post Office.

By 1922 the Post office was again being reported as back to the west near the original location.

In recent years the area to the west side of Brighton Road and spanning the South Platte River to Riverdale Road has become The Adams County Regional Park and the Adams County Community Park.



HUGHES

Initially this location was the site of a stage station run by John Hughes. In 1870 The Denver Pacific Railroad erected Hughes Station. The station was named for Bela M. Hughes (no relation to John Hughes) the first president of the Denver Pacific. Hughes became the eastern terminus of the Boulder Valley Railway and was often called "Hughes Junction."

HUGHES – Continued

In the late 1870's Daniel F. Carmichael began buying lots around Hughes. He platted a townsite which, perhaps his wife named for her hometown in New York State - Brighton Beach.

Please refer to the discussion of Brighton for the later history.

Irondale was another of the small rural or railroad post offices in the South Platte River Valley northeast of Denver. On March 5, 1889 the Irondale Land and Improvement Company filed a plat for a tract of land adjacent to the Chicago, Burlington and Quincy Railroad. The post office opened late that year and closed in 1895.

I have found no information as to why the community was given the name of Irondale.

The 1976 USGS Topographic Map of Adams County (Sheet 1) shows the Irondale name applied to a tract of countryside north of East 80th Avenue and east of Quebec Street.

Drive north from Denver on Interstate 76 to the exit for East 88th Avenue. Go east from the Interstate, crossing to the east side of the Union Pacific tracks and then turn south. That turn will take you into the area that is still known as Irondale.

The area has developed into a largely residential district with a few scattered, small farms. Some of the houses and buildings have been around for many years, but it is difficult to find anything appropriate to photograph. I wound up taking a picture looking north along Quebec Street from next to a small hog farm.

ISLAND STATION

Island Station has been described as a stopping place and post office on the Cheyenne Division of the Union Pacific Railway. At times it was referred to as Henderson's Island, or Henderson's Island Station.

According to the Post Office Department Geographic Site Location Report the Island Station Post Office was nearly a mile west of the railroad and a quarter mile east of the South Platte River.

Henderson's Island was named for Captain Jack Henderson who came to the territory in late 1858. He settled on a parcel of land on the South Platte River and set up the first feed yard and public corral in the region.

I have no clear idea why in 1872 the post office was named Island Station and not Henderson. Perhaps this was due some action of the railroad when it was built through the area to connect Denver with Cheyenne.

In 1894 the name of the Post Office was changed to Henderson and since then the associated community has carried that name.


From Brighton, drive southwest on Brighton Road. This was the old US Highway 85 before construction of the modern four-lane US 85 along the Union Pacific Railroad. Modern Henderson is located on Brighton Road, south of East 124th Avenue. The Island Station Post Office was in this area between East 124th Avenue and East 120th Avenue.

LEADER

Leader was a rural post office about twelve miles northeast of Byers (Arapahoe County). The Post Office Department Geographic Site Location Reports describe four separate locations and indicate that there was at least one more site that had not been formally reported to Washington. Two of these sites were in the same quarter section and may have been the same place, just reported differently.

All of these locations, in the eastern end of Adams County are in a country best suited to ranching. There is and has been some farming, but sufficient water for irrigation is a problem, even in the best of years. Of the five sites, only one has any current activity.

I will assume that you have followed the directions to Thedalund at the intersection of East 88th Avenue with Byers-Calhoun Road. Go east on East 88th Avenue to Behrens Road. Turn north one mile to East 96th Avenue. Turn east on East 96th Avenue four miles to Rector-Leader Road.

At Rector-Leader Road, turn south one mile to what would again be East 88th Avenue. It can barely be considered a road. I did drive a mile east to where the 1909 and the 1919 sites of Leader were reported. I came to locked gates and could go no further. The 1919 site was south of the road and the 1909 site was a short distance to the east and on the north side of the "road." There was no evidence for anything other than some disturbed grass and a couple of trails heading across the countryside.

Return to the intersection of Rector-Leader Road with East 96th Avenue. From the intersection, the 1928 site of Leader was a mile east of Rector-Leader Road and north of the line of East 96th Avenue. The road is overgrown and I did not attempt to drive on it. From Rector-Leader Road, nothing is visible in the distance. From the described intersection, drive north two miles and turn east on East 112th Avenue, one mile to the intersection with Mimosa Avenue. On several maps this intersection is labeled "Leader." At the intersection are a ranch, the Leader Hall and the Leader Fire Station. The ranch yard contains a collection of antique farm machinery. Although there is no Site Location Report for this place, I suspect that in its later years the Leader post office was here.

LIVING SPRINGS

Living Springs was one of the more important stage stations on the Fort Morgan Cut-Off between Fort Morgan on the Platte River Trail and Kiowa Station near present day Bennett. Its life as a post office and stage station was brief, but Living Springs continued to exist as an active site into the 1900's.

2

Living Springs was located near the confluence of Wolf and Comanche Creeks. It took its name from live springs in the bed of the usually dry Comanche Creek. It was the springs that made it an important stop on the notoriously dry Fort Morgan Cut-Off Trail.

To reach this site, begin on Main Street in Strasburg. Drive north on Strasburg Road nine miles to East 96th Avenue. Go a half-mile east, a half-mile north, a half-mile east and another half mile north on Headlight Road to East 104th Avenue. This is a largely open area with trees along the stream. A short distance to the north are a couple of older buildings. These may have been associated with Living Springs, but likely postdate the stage station.



OLESON

Oleson is described as a rural or ranch post office. It is located in an area, where today occupied buildings are few and far between. I doubt that there was ever a community of any sort and believe the Oleson Post Office was at ranches that were willing to provide postal services to their neighbors.

The original post office application requested the name "Prescott." Nellie Prescott was the first postmaster, hence the suggested name. However, by 1916 the Post Office Department was becoming very reluctant to allow post offices to be named for the postmaster. The source of the assigned name, Oleson, is unexplained.

I will assume that you are on a tour of the post office sites in eastern Adams County and have just been to the community of Leader. From Leader drive three miles east on East 112th Avenue to Hanks Crossing Road. Turn south two miles to East 96th Avenue and drive east ten miles to Shamrock Road and then go north three miles to East 120th Avenue.

Drive west three miles on East 120th Avenue. The original site of Oleson was north of the road. There is nothing but open fields on either side of the road. In 1997 this was more a trail than a road. A lot of tumbleweed and more than one mud hole to be carefully traversed. I do not recommend the visit.

Return to Shamrock Road and drive north two miles to East 136th Avenue. Again, drive west. In 1997 I was only able to safely go two miles on a somewhat better road. The 1925 site of Oleson was another mile west and on the north side of the road. In the distance I could see a group of grain storage bins and it is possible that there could be more hidden below the ridge on which the storage bins sit.

QUIMBY

Quimby was a rural post office two miles southeast of Eastlake. Nothing else that I could find has been written about this place. The Quimby Post Office preceded the Eastlake Post Office in the area and although there was no developed community, for a few years it provided postal services for the surrounding ranches and farms. This area is now part of the Metro Denver Complex.

The first postmaster was Maria Quimby, so the post office reflects her family name.

Drive north on Interstate 25 to the exit for East 120th Avenue. Drive east a half mile to Washington Street. Quimby was located in the area south of 120th Avenue and between Washington Street and Interstate 25. Most of that area is now covered by a large shopping complex /mall and apartments. I could not identify any structure that might remain from the 1890's when the Quimby Post office was in operation.

In 1999 the Northglenn Post Office (a Branch Office of Denver) was in this shopping complex.

SCRANTON

Scranton was a coal-mining town sixteen miles east of Denver. Although the post office lasted only a single year, the mine continued to produce for several years.

In 1886 The Denver Railroad Land and Coal Company built 16.3 miles of track from Denver Union Station to Scranton. The railroad was also known as the Denver and Scranton Railroad or the Colorado Eastern Railway. The railroad was abandoned in 1915.

The name of the town may reflect on the extensive coal mines in the area around Scranton, Pennsylvania.

A small community did develop to provide housing and services to the miners.

In 1990, together with Jim Ozment and Bob Richardson I visited the site of Scranton. That is we got within sight of the location, but there was nothing to be seen. We drove into a ranch yard about a mile south of the location. We talked with the lady of the house and she told us that a couple of years earlier there was a cave-in in the northwest corner of their property. They were told that it was a portion of the Scranton Mine that had collapsed. From the ranch house we could see the area, but other than some ground disturbance there was nothing else visible.

To reach the ranch that overlooks the site, I suggest beginning on US Highway 36 at Watkins. Drive west on US 36 to North Hudson Road. Turn north to East 26th Avenue and then turn west two miles to Monaghan Mile Road. Go north one mile and there is an access road into the ranch, a half-mile west of Monaghan Mile Road. Another possibility for an overview is to go two miles north of East 26th Avenue and look to the west. Scranton would have been about a mile from the road.

SCRANTON - Continued

A word of caution: it has been sixteen years since we made the visit to Scranton. It is likely that a lot has changed in that time. Denver International Airport was barely on the drawing boards at the time and I would expect that there has been residential development in the general area.

I have found no mention of this place in any of the references I have read about the history of Colorado. That is somewhat surprising as the post office lasted for nine years.

The Post Office Department Geographical Site Location Report places the post office north of the Chicago, Burlington and Quincy Railroad and in the extreme northwestern corner of section 13, Township 3 South, Range 68 West. That location is virtually on the boundary line with the City and County of Denver.

The site is north and east of the intersection of Brighton Road and York Street. In 1999 that area was occupied by a large brickyard with cement blocks, ornamental stone and other building materials. The Riverside Cemetery is north and west of those streets. The area surrounding the site of Sigman is part of the industrial section on the north edge of the City of Denver.



SIMPSON

Simpson was a rural/ranch post office at the extreme eastern end of Adams County. It had a history somewhat more extended than the usual ranch post office. During that period it moved several times. There is no evidence that any of the locations was more than an individual ranch and none of the sites is currently occupied.

The Simpson Post Office was at four different locations. Three of those were in Adams County and the fourth was just across the line into Washington County (SW/4 Sec 19 T2S R56W). There is no explanation as to why the final location was reported on three separate documents within the month of February 1941.

I will describe directions to the Simpson locations starting from US Highway 36. If you are coming from the north via Winnview Road (from Frost and Eskdale) you should be able to locate yourself based on the crossroads of East 56th Avenue and East 88th Avenue with Winnview Road.

Winnview Road intersects US Highway 36 two miles east of the Adams-Washington County Line. Turn north on Winnview Road and go four miles to East 56th Avenue. Turn west on East 56th Avenue three miles to the original (1910) site of Simpson. The site was north of the road. There is abundant evidence of farming, but no remnant signs of any structures. Return to Winnview Road and continue north three miles. For the next three miles there has been a lot of activity along Winnview Road, but most of it is related to oil and gas production. A number of wells, storage tanks and related facilities are present. The 1926 site of Simpson was just south of this activity, about where East 80th Avenue would be. Once again it is open fields with no period structures.

Continue north to East 88th Avenue and turn east. Go two miles, crossing into Washington County. The 1916 site of Simpson, in Washington County, was adjacent to the County Line and on the north side of the road. In 1997 the only thing there was a pile of dead trees.

Meridian Road is on the Adams-Washington County Line. From East 88th Avenue, drive south one mile. The final site of Simpson (1941) was on the west side of Meridian Road. And once again it is nothing but an open field.

If you have followed my wanderings around eastern Adams County you will have observed that there is very little to be seen at any of the sites that were once home to a post office. It almost appears that there has been some specific effort to remove all abandoned structures from the countryside. Once you cross the line into either Morgan or Washington County, suddenly at most of the abandoned sites in those counties, there are still remnants to be found.

STRASBURG

On August 15, 1870 construction crews of the Kansas Pacific Railroad, one building east and the other building west, met at Comanche Crossing. At that point the two portions of the railroad were joined. The Kansas Pacific bridge across the Mississippi River had been completed on June 30, 1869, thus this event marked the true completion of an uninterrupted trans-continental railroad.

2

In 1875 the railroad, operated by the Union Pacific, placed a siding at Comanche Crossing and renamed the place Strasburg for John Strasburg who had led one of the construction crews. The town of Strasburg did not develop until 1890 when Dugald H. Weaver, who had homesteaded the site, laid out the lots for the town. Mr. Weaver built the first store and was the first postmaster of Strasburg.

Strasburg was in the center of a large area devoted to farming and ranching. Located on the railroad, it became a shipping point for livestock and produce and a supply center for the surrounding ranches and farms. It continues to serve those functions, but as the Denver Metropolitan area continues to expand eastward, Strasburg is increasingly becoming a residential area.

Strasburg is located just north of the Adams-Arapahoe county Line. Access to the town is from Interstate 70 at Exit 310.



I have encountered only brief mentions of Swinford in the Colorado historical literature. It is described as a ranch post office on Comanche Creek, ten miles north of Strasburg.

Based on that description, I believe that Swinford was a short distance north of the earlier location of Living Springs, in the quarter section that is the northwest corner of the intersection of Headlight Road and East 112th Avenue. There are no buildings, but there are some trees and evidence of disturbed ground. Follow the directions to Living Springs and continue north.

One reference identifies this place as "Swimford."


Thedalund was a rural post office northeast of Strasburg. There is no evidence of an organized community at the site. The post office was at a ranch and served other ranches and farms in the area.

When Charles J. Clark applied for a post office, he requested the name Clarkton. That choice was rejected, probably to avoid confusion with Clark in Routt County and Clarkville in Yuma County. I have no information as to the derivation of the name Thedalund.

There are several possible ways to visit the site of Thedalund. I will describe the simplest one. Begin in Strasburg and drive east on Main Street, US Highway 36. At the fork in the road keep straight ahead, due east, passing the rest stop. Highway 36 actually joins the Interstate from there to Byers. Six miles east from Strasburg you will rejoin Highway 36. Go one mile further east and turn north on Calhoun-Byers Road. In 2005 there was a sign pointing north to Hoyt. Drive eight miles north to East88th Avenue. Thedalund was in the southeast corner of the intersection. Nothing remains at the site, but disturbed ground is evidence of some former activity.

WASHBURN

Washburn was a railroad post office located 205 feet west of the Union Pacific Railroad and about three miles south-southwest of Henderson. The post office lasted only a few years before the name was changed to Hazeltine in 1893. For a few months in 1892 the post office was named "Derblay."

I have found no other information about Washburn or a source of the name. The name "Washburn" does not appear on modern maps.

The location given below plots within the triangle that is formed by East 104th Avenue, Interstate 76 and US Highway 85. Within that triangle there are a few light industrial businesses, all of fairly recent construction.

WATKINS

The community of Watkins was established in 1872 by the Kansas Pacific Railroad. It was about a mile west of an earlier settlement and stage station named "Box Elder" for nearby Box Elder Creek. In 1877, when the post office was obtained, it took the name of Watkins, for a local rancher, L. A. Watkins. On March 2, 1888, John Fetzer and others filed a plat for the town of Watkins.

Watkins developed as an agricultural community providing supplies and a shipping point for local ranchers and farmers. It still performs some of those duties, but as the Denver Metropolitan Complex continues to expand eastward, Watkins is increasingly becoming a suburb of Denver.

The growth is reflected in the location of the Watkins Post office. In 1990 it was in a small building in the business district. In 2005 it was in a new, much larger building on the edge of the community.

Watkins is mostly on the north side of Interstate 70 and can be accessed from either Exit 292 or Exit 295.





WELBY

On September 10, 1909 the Northwestern Land Development Company filed a town plat for Welby. Previously at the site there had been an unorganized community named "Cline."

Welby was near the Denver, Laramie and Northwestern Railroad and today the Union Pacific tracks are just east of the area that is still shown as "Welby" on modern maps.

Welby was named for General Arthur E. Welby president of the Denver, Laramie and Northwestern Railroad.

I have no solid information as to what type of community Welby might have been. Its location in the bottomlands north of the junction of Clear Creek with the South Platte River permits an assumption that it was a farming community.

Drive north on Interstate 25 to the exit for East 84th Avenue. Go east to Washington Street and then south to East 78th Avenue. Drive east to York Street. Welby was east of York Street and spanned East 78th Avenue. A large, attractive brick building that is the Assumption Church and School occupies the northeast corner of the intersection. There are a number of modest homes in the surrounding area.

WESTMINSTER

Homesteaders Pleasant DeSpain and Edward Bruce Bowles were the first permanent settlers in this area. Eventually there was a railroad station that took the name of DeSpain Junction. On June 27, 1890 Henry Lowe and T. Hagerman filed a town plat for Harris Park. Other names applied to this place were Harrisburg and finally Harris, when a post office was granted in 1890.

In 1891 Stanford White of New York organized a Presbyterian College at Harris. It was known as Westminster University. This "Princeton of the West" stood on Crown Point, the highest hill in the county. Nearby the town's pioneer settler, Pleasant De Spain, Sr. had built a sod house and homesteaded at what is now the intersection of West 76th Avenue and Lowell Blvd. The University closed in 1917, but in 1909 the town was incorporated under the name of Westminster.

In 1920 the University property was acquired by the "Pillar of Fire" Church and became the Pillar of Fire Institute.

At first Westminster was a small community serving the University and providing supplies to farmers and ranches in the surrounding area. In recent years Westminster has grown into the second largest city in Adams County and has become virtually indistinguishable from the City of Denver and its other northern suburbs. It is now a typical mixture of residential area, commercial sections and industrial sites.

In 1999 the Westminster Post Office was on the east side of Meade Street between West 72nd Avenue and West 73rd Avenue. At the time a new post office for Westminster was under construction at Federal Boulevard and West 105th Avenue. After several delays, that 30,000 square foot facility opened in 2000.
