



## **DELTA COUNTY**

Delta County lies in the west central portion of Colorado, beyond the limits of the precious metal mining districts. However, mining has played a part in the county's development. Extensive coal deposits along the North Fork of the Gunnison River have been exploited since the early days of settlement on the western slope. Most of the production was in the area from Hotchkiss northeast through Paonia and Bowie to Somerset in Gunnison County. There are still large, productive mines at Paonia, near the site of Bowie and nearby at Somerset in Gunnison County. Coal is shipped from these mines to produce electricity.

The area was slow to develop. It remained largely Ute Indian Territory until the late 1870's when, following the Meeker Massacre, the Northern Utes were removed to reservations in Utah. What is today Delta County was originally a part of Lake County, which at first reached from the Continental Divide to the Utah border. Lake County was gradually reduced with the creation of several new counties. By 1883, the area that is now Delta was included in Gunnison County. On February 11, 1883 an act of the State Legislature created Delta County with the boundaries that it still retains.

The county is a rough, right triangle in outline with an eastern, north-south boundary of approximately thirty-nine miles. The southern, east-west boundary is some forty-eight miles in length. The western boundary is less than twelve miles in length. The northern boundary is irregular and is largely dictated by the drainage divide between the Gunnison and the Colorado Rivers. This northern boundary, from 4,800-feet at the Gunnison River, climbs on to Grand Mesa to elevations approaching 11,000 feet on top of the mesa. Only three counties border Delta County: Gunnison County on the east, Montrose County on the south and west and Mesa County on the west and north.

The name of the county is a reference to the extensive, alluvial delta that was formed by the junction of the principal forks of the Gunnison River and the Uncompany River. This created a territory that although far from level, was not as rugged as the surrounding mountains. The river valleys became travel routes, first for the Indians and then for others travelling to the west and south.

Drainage of the county is to the west and is dominated by the Gunnison River, which enters the county from the south from the famed Black Canyon of the Gunnison. It is joined by the Smith Fork, from the east at Crawford, next by the North Fork from Somerset and Paonia and then by Surface Creek which drains the southeastern slope of Grand Mesa. The Uncompany River flows north out of Montrose County to join with the Gunnison at Delta.

The modern highways that serve the county are US 50, from Montrose and points east through Delta to Grand Junction and points west. Colorado Highway 92 follows the North Fork of the Gunnison to Hotchkiss where Highway 133 continues over McClure Pass and on to Glenwood Springs on the Colorado River. Colorado Highway 65 goes north from Colorado 92 through Cedaredge and crosses over Grand Mesa to the Colorado River Valley.

Railroad service for Delta County has been the province of the Denver and Rio Grande. The D&RG first built from Montrose to the Gunnison River at Delta, then down the canyon of the Gunnison to Grand Junction. A branch line was built from Delta east and north to Somerset to tap the coal mines along the North Fork of the Gunnison.

The land along the rivers was found to be fertile and quickly developed into farm and ranch land. Being somewhat protected from harsh winters, the region along the southeastern slope of Grand Mesa became a prime area for fruit orchards. That particular area is unique in Colorado, a portion of it is included in the corporate boundaries of Orchard City. However, there has never been an Orchard or


Orchard City Post Office in Delta County. This "city" has been, and is still, served by three post offices within its boundaries: Austin, Cory and Eckert.

Development in the county was largely related to agriculture; hence most of the settlements that acquired post offices were located along the rivers or other larger streams. Coalby and Suttle, on the slope of Grand Mesa, also depended on agriculture but Grand Mesa, on top of the mesa was developed as a resort and is still the site of a good number of summer cabins and small resorts. Since the origin of the county, the community of Delta has been the county's principal city and its county seat.


Historical information about Delta County, in particular the small, short-lived communities, is sparse. Many of them have been mentioned only briefly, if at all. One, Verne, is a total mystery, with not even a Post Office Department Geographic Site Location Report for guidance.

Post Office Location Map – Westen Delta County




Post Office Location Map – Eastern Delta County

### ALDA

Alda is one of four small settlements in Delta County that have escaped even a brief mention in the historical literature. It was located about six miles east-southeast of Hotchkiss and three miles north-northwest of Crawford.

From my visit to the site, it appears to have been a ranch post office that served a few ranches in the area between Hotchkiss and Crawford. Its short existence, less than twenty months, reinforces the thought that there was little need for the office and it is likely that it became a victim of the expanding Rural Free Delivery system.

To reach the site, from Hotchkiss and the junction with Colorado Highway 133, drive south six miles on Colorado Highway 92. Turn west one half-mile on County Road F50, then south on County Road 3675. Another half-mile brings you to the location given by the Post Office Department Geographical Site Location Report. There is an occupied ranch on each side of Road 3675. There is an old log building at the ranch on the west side of the road, which in all likelihood could date from the time of the Alda Post Office.

The surrounding countryside is rolling hills and appears to be used for livestock production. The post office name was originally suggested as Grandview but was changed to Alda by the Post Office Department. There is no indication of the source of the name but it could have been derived from the name of the first and only postmaster: Albert A. Ferrier.

## AUSTIN

The community of Austin was established in 1900 when Dr. Austin E. Miller provided land for the townsite and the right-of-way for the Denver and Rio Grande Railroad. Dr. Miller was from Iowa and suffered from tuberculosis. He came to Colorado seeking better health, acquired considerable land holdings in the area east of Delta and became involved in ranching and the fruit growing industry. The community was named for Dr. Austin Miller.

Austin developed into a modest sized village with a number of businesses that served the surrounding ranchers and farmers. It also had a railroad depot at which, produce from the Surface Creek region was shipped to market.

Today Austin is still an occupied community with facilities for packing and shipping fruit. The village is located a few hundred yards north of Colorado Highway 92, about six miles east of Delta.



### BOWIE

Bowie has always been a coal camp. It was a creation of the Juanita Coal & Coke Company and although I have not seen confirmation, I believe the Juanita was related to Juanita, Pennsylvania. The original name applied to the community was Reading, another tieback to the coal fields of Pennsylvania. There is also one reference that claims another early name for the settlement was Wauneta but that is more likely a mis-statement of Juanita.

When the post office was established in 1907, it could not use the name Juanita because there was an operating post office with that name in Archuleta County. The name that was adopted honored Alexander Bowie, who operated coal mines in the east and the west and in 1906 was involved in the development of the mine at Bowie. Alexander Bowie died in 1917 and operation of the mine passed to his four sons. They continued operation until 1974 when the Juanita Coal and Coke Company was sold to the Adolph Coors Company of Golden, Colorado. I do not know who currently owns the mine.

From its inception Bowie was a company town and it is claimed that Coors did not realize that the purchase of the coal mine also included the town. The Bowie Post Office had closed in 1967 and it is possible that Coors was not enthusiastic about owning a town and they may have discouraged continued residence.

I visited Bowie in September 2000 and at that time there were still a few scattered, small residences that appeared to be occupied. The mine at Bowie is located several hundred feet up the north side of the valley above Bowie. Coal is trucked down a steep road from the mine and onward to the railroad at Paonia for shipment.

The entrance to Bowie is about four miles east of Paonia on the north side of Colorado Highway 133. I believe that this road was the original Colorado 133, which has been relocated and greatly improved. I thought that this road would reconnect to 133 but three miles east of Bowie I was still on the old road.



## CEDAREDGE

Cedaredge is the principal town along Colorado Highway 65, the road to Grand Mesa. Settlement began in 1882 on the ranch of Henry Kohler. Kohler named his ranch Cedar Edge, as it was located on the edge of a band of cedar trees on the southeastern slope of Grand Mesa. 1894, when a post office was requested, was during a period of time when the Post Office Department was actively discouraging long and multiple word names for post offices - the shorter the better. Hence, Cedar Edge was reduced to Cedaredge.

Around 1890 the community began to grow and John Zainetti was engaged in the sale of building lots on a ten-acre townsite that had been set aside. A vote to incorporate Cedaredge was held in March 1907 and the town has gradually grown from the original ten acres to approximately a square mile (640 acres).

Cedaredge is an active community with businesses serving the surrounding ranch and farming country. There is also a small Pioneer Museum in Cedaredge, which includes several old log buildings. An annual festival, Pioneer Days, celebrates the area's past history and has been subject of special commemorative postmarks.

The book, *Surface Creek Country* by Hazel Baker Austin, details the history of the Cedaredge Post Office. From her description it would seem that almost every time the postmaster changed, the post office moved to a new location within Cedaredge. My first visit to Cedaredge was in 1972 at which time the post office occupied a neat but small brick building. By the fall of 2000 the post office had moved again, to a larger more impressive brick building where it seems likely to remain for the future. It is on a side street, one block south of Main Street and to the west of Colorado Highway 65.

To reach Cedaredge drive about three miles east from Delta on Colorado Highway 92. Turn north on Colorado 65 towards Grand Mesa and it is about 10 miles to Cedaredge. The town is sited on the slope of Grand Mesa at a point just before Colorado 65 becomes a winding road climbing up on to the mesa.

The countryside surrounding Cedaredge is largely ranchland with some farming and orchard production in the lower and more sheltered elevations. Since its inception, the town has served the agricultural community. It continues to do so today, but it also provides services and shopping for tourists and the recreational activities on Grand Mesa.





Chipeta, the wife of famed Ute chieftain Ouray, has had her name used for three different post offices in Colorado. All three offices lasted less than one year. One was in Montrose County and after eleven months its name was changed to Naturita. Another was in Pitkin County on the western side of Independence Pass. It was located in the mining community known as Independence but whose post office was at various time named Sidney, Farwell and Sparkill, in addition to Chipeta. There was also, for several years, a Chipita Park Post Office in El Paso County.

#### **CHIPETA – Continued**

This particular Chipeta was southeast of Delta and just north of the Montrose County line. It was a station on the Denver and Rio Grande Railroad but other than that it has received no mention in the historical literature.

As stated, the site is just north of the Delta-Montrose County line, on US Highway 50. There is a large ranch in the vicinity on the east side of the highway but the buildings there are of more modern construction than the brief period of the Chipeta Post Office. I can but assume that this was an attempt to provide a postal facility for the ranches and farmers in the area between Olathe and Delta. The establishment was rescinded, perhaps because of the growth of the Rural Free Delivery system, thus it seems unlikely that the office was ever in operation.

### COALBY

The Coalby Post Office was located about three miles northwest of Cedaredge. Andrew Watson developed whatever community existed, petitioned for the post office and was the first postmaster. He suggested the name Coalby because of some nearby coal mines. These mines were small and were not significant producers. Today the area is largely devoted to farming and ranching.

The Coalby Post Office closed in 1912, a victim of the expanding Rural Free Delivery system.

To reach the site of Coalby, from Cedaredge drive west on Main Street a little more than two miles to the intersection with Delta County Road 2075 to the north. Main Street may actually be a continuation of Road 2075. Turn right about three miles to County Road T50. Turn left and in about one half-mile you will cross Williams Creek. Coalby was located on the east side of the creek. There is a fairly new house there with some associated older structures. There is a nice mix of new homes and decrepit barns in the area, so it appears that the area no longer depends on agriculture but has become more residential in nature.



## CORY


Cory is one of the three post offices within the boundaries of Orchard City. Like Cedaredge it has, according to Hazel Baker Austin, had a peripatetic existence, moving frequently with the changes of postmaster. In the early 1950's Colorado Highway 65 was relocated, bypassing much of the community. At the time Bertha Lugar was postmaster, operating the post office in the family store with her husband Tom. In 1953 the Lugars built a new store on the relocated highway and the post office was still operating at that location in September 2002.

This portion of Delta County is agricultural with fruit growing a major business activity.

To reach Cory, drive east from Delta on Colorado Highway 92 and turn north on Colorado Highway 65. From the intersection it is about two miles to Cory. The combination store, gas station and post office is on the east side of Highway 65. As a post office it is not all that obvious. This was another instance where I was having difficulty finding the post office, stopped and went into the store, asked the clerk where the post office was located and was informed that, "I was standing in it."

The present day community of Cory consists of a number of residences scattered over a square mile or more. There are also some small businesses related to the agricultural industry.

Cory, Colorado — Cory General Store and Post Office Photograph by W. H. Bauer September 22, 2000



#### CRAWFORD

Crawford was established in 1882 as a community to serve agriculture in the southeastern portion of Delta County and portions of Montrose County north of the Gunnison River and the Black Canyon of the Gunnison. The town continues to serve that purpose. With the creation of the Black Canyon of the Gunnison National Park and the development of visitor facilities on the north side of the canyon, Crawford has avoided the significant declines in population and activity that have struck many of the smaller communities in this area of Colorado.

Development of the town is credited to George Crawford, a frontier capitalist, speculator and former governor of Kansas. Crawford was a prominent figure of the western slope during the 1880's and is also credited with helping to found Grand Junction and Delta. The name of the town honors Crawford's contribution to its development.

The initial Post Office Department Geographic Site Location Report dated March 23, 1883, for Crawford raises an intriguing question. The report indicates that initially the desired name for this new post office was Leon. That entry was crossed out and Crawford was substituted. There is also a Geographic Site Location Report for a Leon in Mesa County. That report is dated March 20, 1883 – three days earlier. The locations and persons mentioned on these two reports are different. But, is it possible that there may have been more than coincidence in the names?

There is no difficulty in finding Crawford. From Delta, drive east on Colorado Highway 92 to Hotchkiss and stay on that road after its intersection with Colorado 133. From Hotchkiss, for most of the distance the road goes southeast or south, but about three miles from Crawford the road swings due east for a mile and a half before once again turning southeast, a mile from Crawford. The first location for Crawford, according to the Geographic Site Location Reports was just west of this final turn to the southeast. Today there is nothing to indicate that this was more than an interim location before the community was firmly established on the Smith Fork of the Gunnison.



## DELTA

Shortly after the Ute Indians were relocated to Utah, George A. Crawford, the founder of Grand Junction, purchased the squatter rights of W. O. Stephens to a tract of land at the junction of the Uncompaghre and Gunnison Rivers. On October 1, 1881 The Uncompahyre Town Company, consisting of George A. Crawford, M. C. Vandeventer and a Mr. Anderson selected and had surveyed a town site to be named Uncompahyre. In December 1881 an application for a post office was filed. However, there was already an Uncompahyre Post Office, not only in Colorado, but also in the same county - Gunnison County at that time. Therefore the name Delta was chosen, being drawn from the townsite's location on the fertile delta formed by the junction of the two rivers.

Growth of the community of Delta was slow until 1883 when two events provided it with a solid foundation for the future. With the formation of Delta County on February 11, 1883, Delta was chosen to be the county seat. In the same year, The Denver and Rio Grande Railroad entered Delta as its construction progressed west towards Grand Junction.

For its prosperity, Delta has relied on no single industry. It is located in the center of a fertile agricultural region, which has developed into a diversified farming and ranching area. Delta also became the principal supply, trading and shipping point for a large area lying between Montrose and Grand Junction. In recent years, its moderate climate has attracted light industry to this portion of the Gunnison Valley. Delta is a well developed, modern community, located on US Highway 50 with a rail connection to Grand Junction.







### DOMINGUEZ

Dominguez was a station on the Denver and Rio Grande Railroad approximately 15 miles westnorthwest of Delta. In this area, the Gunnison River has incised a canyon some 500 feet in depth. The name of the station and settlement commemorates Fray Atanasio Dominguez, member of a 1776 Spanish expedition through what is now western Colorado. The Hayden Survey of the 1870's honored the leaders of that expedition with the naming of Dominguez and Escalante Creeks.

Fruit growing is a principal activity in this portion of the Gunnison Canyon. It is unlikely that Dominguez was ever more than a railroad station, siding and a group of ranch buildings. The post office would have served other ranches and farms along this portion of the Gunnison River.

### **DOMINGUEZ** – Continued

From Delta, drive west on US 50 about eleven miles to County Road J50. This is a dead end gravel road that goes from the highway down to the river. Near the foot of the grade is an intersection marked by a group of mailboxes. Now begins some confusion. Take the left-hand branch of this fork. The right hand fork leads only to an overlook. It is a half-mile more to a Y intersection.



The United States Geological Survey maps label this intersection as Dominguez. In 2000 there was nothing to be found at this location. However, the Post Office Department Geographic Site Location Report for Dominguez locates the post office a little more than a mile up the right-hand fork of this Y. That location is labeled as Broughton on the USGS maps. At that point there is a large orchard and ranch with several buildings. One of the buildings is close to the railroad and is probably a warehouse for shipping. It could have been a railroad station to serve the farmers along this portion of the river. It is an attractive setting and in spite of the USGS maps, I favor this as the location for Dominguez. The notation in the Site Location Report that, "(Dominguez Signal station was two miles southeast)" supports this.

## ECKERT

Eckert is another of the small communities that lie within the boundaries of Orchard City, along Colorado Highway 65 on the way to Grand Mesa.

The name of the community, Eckert, is the maiden name of Elizabeth States, wife of the first postmaster, Adelbert States. There is some confusion regarding this postmaster's name. On the original Geographic Site Location Report, it appears to be Slater. I have also seen references that spell it as Slates but the majority opinion favors States. The post office was initially located in the store operated by Mr. States.

On my 1972 visit to Eckert, and still in 2000, the post office was in a brick structure in front of, and attached to a residence on the east side of Highway 65. It is across the street from the Presbyterian Church.

Eckert is a small community of several homes, an old school and a Presbyterian Church. It is a more compact community than either Austin or Cory.

Like Austin and Cory, Eckert's economy was and is based on agriculture in the surrounding countryside.

Eckert is about four miles from Cory to the south and Cedaredge to the north.



## ESCALANTE

This settlement was located at the mouth of Escalante Creek where it joins the Gunnison River. It is recorded as a "Denver and Rio Grande stop near the confluence of Escalante Creek and the Gunnison River."

It was named for Father Francisco Silvestre Velez Escalante, another of the principals in the 1776 Spanish exploration of what is now western Colorado. If indeed this was a railroad stop, it is likely that it was little more than a siding and a depot for use of ranchers and farmers along this portion of the Gunnison River.

Although Escalante appears in the Records of Postmaster Appointments, those records indicate that Charles Blair, the appointed postmaster, declined the appointment and subsequently the establishment was rescinded.

As with Dominguez, the site of Escalante is reached by driving down into the Gunnison Canyon from US Highway 50. I suspect that I did not visit the correct location. Using the entrance to the Delta County Correctional Facility as a marker, continue west on US 50 4.3 miles.

The road I chose to take is on the left side and is just after you exit a road cut and before you cross a drainage. This is not a county road and maintenance is poor. The road brings you down to the river and turns to the southeast or upstream. About a mile further the road peters out at a point where there is evidence for some type of building having been present.

I now suspect that Escalante was about a mile downstream from where the above-described road reached the river. From maps, this is where Escalante was more likely located. Indications are that by going west a mile further on US 50, there is a county road, which goes into the canyon, crosses the river and continues southwest up Escalante Creek. This will be investigated when I am on a future trip to visit the site of the Escalante Forks Post Office in Mesa County.

### **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION**

The following was included in High Country Wanderings, Volume 19, Number 1.

In the spring, Jim Ozment and I once again set off for the Western Slope. It was a catch-up tour, to visit several sites that for one reason or another we had passed on during previous trips. Included were two places in Delta County, Roubideau and Escalante, for which my information had been in error. In the case of Escalante, I simply went down the wrong road. Roubideau is still a puzzle. The Post Office Department location is several miles east of Delta but the true location is a few miles west of Delta. My only explanation is that there was a change in the Federal Land Survey subsequent to the original report.

To reach what is likely the site for the proposed Escalante Post Office, turn west from US Highway 50 onto the road to Escalante Canyon. This is about 10 miles west of Delta. In 2003 there was a small rest stop at that intersection. Follow the road to the bridge over the Gunnison River. Escalante was somewhere in this area. Perhaps at a siding on the east side of the river or perhaps at the ranch complex on the west side. This road continues on to Escalante Forks in Mesa County, 24 miles from US Highway 50.


#### **GRAND MESA**

The Grand Mesa Post Office was at a location on top of the mesa itself, within the boundaries of the Grand Mesa National Forest and at an elevation in excess of 10,000 feet. After reaching the top of the Mesa via Colorado Highway 65 from Cedaredge, you enter an area of small lakes and reservoirs. The visitor's center is opposite the east end of Island Lake. The road that leads to the visitor center continues on approximately a mile and a half to Hotel Lake (and beyond). On the east side of the small stream that drains from Hotel Lake is the well-maintained Alexander Lake Lodge. Beyond the lodge are a number of cabins along the road and on the edge of Baron Lake. Hotel Lake is also ringed with cabins and there is a recreational vehicle park. The Alexander Lake Lodge appears to have been in existence for a considerable period of time. It is a likely place for the Grand Mesa Post Office to have been located and this is in general agreement with the specifications in the 1941 Geographic Site Location Report.

At least from 1954 until the final closing at the end of August 1958, the Grand Mesa Post Office was a summer operation only: from mid-June until mid-September. Since this area was a resort community, I suspect that the summer operation schedule was in effect prior to 1954 and perhaps throughout the life of this office.

## HOTCHKISS

Hotchkiss was founded in 1881 and has become one of the principal towns on the North Fork of the Gunnison River. Enos Hotchkiss was one of the earliest settlers, establishing himself even before the Ute Indians had been removed from the area. The town was named for Enos. Hotchkiss was incorporated March 14, 1901.

#### **HOTCHKISS – Continued**

Since its founding, Hotchkiss has been a community that depended on agriculture and ranching for its economic base. With the development of a fruit growing industry along the North Fork, Hotchkiss became a center for that activity. In addition to agriculture, coal mining along the North Fork has also contributed to the economic health of Hotchkiss.

Hotchkiss has an active business district that serves the surrounding area. The growth of Hotchkiss and the fruit industry was substantially boosted by the construction of a branch line of the Denver and Rio Grande Railroad through the valley. The railroad reached Hotchkiss on September 18, 1902.

Hotchkiss is on Colorado Highway 92 at the junction with Colorado 133, the road to McClure Pass and Glenwood Springs.

Since at least 1972 the post office has occupied a brick building on the north side of the main street (Colorado 92).





# LAZEAR

The town of Lazear was established in 1910 by B. M. Stone and was named for J. B. Lazear, a pioneer settler. Lazear was a supply point for the fruit and livestock industry of the surrounding area.

The business center of the community is on Delta County Road 3100, a mile south of Colorado Highway 92. Road 3100 is three miles west of Hotchkiss. There are a number of small residences randomly spaced along this road and in the nearby area. It is obvious that this was once a larger and more prosperous town than it is today. There are still many residences along Road 3100 but the business district is largely past history.

### LAZEAR – Continued

In 2000, the Lazear Post Office was located in the same general store building where it was in 1972. That, plus an oil supply service on the other side of the street appear to comprise the business district of Lazear. The inability of stores in small towns to survive in competition with those in nearby, larger communities is an unpleasant fact of business life at the beginning of the twenty-first century.



Marion was a predecessor of Austin. It came into existence when a man by the name of W. K. "Ark" Hall erected a log building at the foot of the Cory Grade. Other than that bit of information, I have found no other historical reference to this Marion. Be advised that there was intermittently (1899-1912) a Marion Post Office in Garfield County. That office was at a coal mine.

To visit the site of Marion, drive east from Delta on Colorado Highway 92 and turn north on Delta County Road 220 into the community of Austin. It is likely that the Marion Post office was along the road into Austin and between Canal Street and Highway 92.

#### PAONIA

In 1881 Samuel Wade, a rancher, established a general merchandise store at a location on the North Fork of the Gunnison River. The settlement was briefly known locally as Wade's Ranch. In 1882 Wade submitted a request for the establishment of a post office with the name *Paeonia*, the botanical name of the peony flower. The postal authorities modified the spelling to Paonia, apparently believing that to be more appropriate. *Paeonia* is derived from Paeon, the physician of the Greek gods.

In addition to ranching, Wade planted an orchard and thus contributed to the beginnings of the fruit industry in this portion of the North Fork Valley. Paonia became a major supply point for surrounding ranches and farms and continues to enjoy that status. Paonia has a well-developed business district and many residences. The history and economic development of Paonia and Hotchkiss are similar.

Paonia gained commercial stature with the development of coal mining along the upper reaches of the North Fork. At the end of the twentieth century Paonia is home to many of those employed by the coal mines at Paonia and Bowie. There is a large coal mine at Paonia and coal from the mine at Bowie is trucked to Paonia for loading and shipment by rail to power plants for the generation of electricity.

Starting from Delta, drive east on Colorado Highway 92 to Hotchkiss. From Hotchkiss, take Colorado Highway 133 another eight miles. Paonia is approximately a half-mile south of Highway 133. The post office (September 2000) is on Grand Avenue, where it has been since at least 1972.





# READ

Read was a farming community located about a mile and a half southwest of Austin along Colorado Highway 92. The name of the community honors John Read, a Civil War veteran and one of the pioneer settlers in the region. Read was another of the stations along the North Fork Branch of the Denver and Rio Grande Railroad. Although the post office at Read survived more than thirty years, it appears that this was never a sizeable community. In 2000 there were still several residences scattered in the area and a large building, near the intersection of Highway 92 and Delta county Road H75, may have been a store and possibly home to the Read Post Office. That building has been converted to a residence.

The initial Geographic Site Location Report for this office requested the name Iola. However, that was in conflict with the existing Iola Post Office in Gunnison County on the Gunnison River. Therefore, the name Read was the alternate choice.

#### **COMMENT:**

The area that has been incorporated as Orchard City has had a rather interesting postal history. There have been five different named post offices in or adjacent to Orchard City. They are, in order of their establishment:

This was a fertile agricultural area that developed early. It is a puzzle why, for a period of five years (1886-1891) it lacked a post office but by 1905 it was being served by four post offices; all of these were in the six mile stretch between Read and Eckert.



#### ROUBIDEAU

There is a question concerning the location of this post office. The Federal Land Survey location specified in the Post Office Department Geographical Site Location Report is about three miles southeast of Austin in Peach Valley. However, all mentions of Roubideau that I have found in historical literature refer to a location about five miles west of Delta on the Gunnison River, the Denver and Rio Grande Railroad and the east side of Roubideau Creek. It is more confusing that the verbal description of the location, as given in the Site Location Report, fits this place west of Delta. Perhaps, on my next visit to this area, I will investigate this other location.

It is not uncommon in Colorado to have the same name applied to a post office and to a railroad station and/or siding but which are at considerably different locations. For now, without more information, I will accept the Post Office Department's survey location for the Roubideau Post Office.

The name Roubideau was for Antoine Roubideau, a French fur trader operating out of St. Louis, Missouri. His name has also been spelled Robideau, Robidoux and Roubidoux. In 1837 Roubideau constructed Fort Uncompany, a short-lived trading post near Delta. Captain John W. Gunnison noted the ruins of this fort when he passed through the area on his 1853 journey of exploration.

To visit or observe, the Post Office Department's location for Roubideau: From Colorado Highway 92, drive south on Delta County Road 220 (the road into Austin) one mile to County Road H75. Turn east on H75 and keep to the right at a fork in the road. The road then bears southeast around the base of Smiths Mountain. Go about two miles to where the road turns east at the south end of Smiths Mountain. There is a slight rise here from where you can look southwest over the claimed location for Roubideau. There is really nothing to be seen and there is no access to the exact location, unless you want to walk out across a rather barren, sagebrush covered flat.

If this was the site of Roubideau, I doubt that it was more than a ranch that had only a brief and unsuccessful period of existence.

# **ROUBIDEAU – Continued ADDITIONAL INFORMATION**

The following was included in High Country Wanderings, Volume 19, Number 1.

In the spring, Jim Ozment and I once again set off for the Western Slope. It was a "catch-up" tour, to visit several sites that for one reason or another we had passed on during previous trips. Included were two places in Delta County, Roubideau and Escalante, for which my information had been in error. In the case of Escalante I simply went down the wrong road. Roubideau is still a puzzle. The Post Office Department location is several miles east of Delta but the true location is a few miles west of Delta. My only explanation is that there was a change in the Federal Land Survey subsequent to the original report.

To reach what I now believe to be the correct site for Roubideau, from Delta, drive west on Fifth Street keeping straight at a fork in the road. The road goes up over a low hill then drops back down into a wide level valley. From the hill, looking down into the valley you are overlooking the site of Roubideau, which was along the south side of the railroad. Roubideau was at the western end of the siding. There is an historical marker and signs of plenty of activity but no structures remain.

The information in historical literature that references Suttle is sparse indeed. All that I have found are brief referrals to maps that place it northeast of Cedaredge and between the headwaters of Surface Creek and Currant Creek. The Post Office Department Geographic Site Location Report states that it was in an unsurveyed area and that it was on Surface Creek. From that document it appears that it was named for its first and only postmaster: Andrew P. Suttle. I further assume that it was a ranch post office intended to serve a few families in a rather remote area on the slope of Grand Mesa.

#### **SUTTLE – Continued**

In September 2000, with only that fragmentary information, I set out to see if I could find anything that seemed reasonable as a location for Suttle.

From Cedaredge I drove three and one-half miles north on Colorado Highway 65 to Delta County Road U 50. From there I went east 1.7 miles to Road 2500 and turned north on that road. In another two miles the pavement ended and after another mile the road makes a sharp right-hand turn for a few hundred feet before again turning north. At that point I found the Bryce Lodge, a rather rustic appearing guest ranch. From its appearance it has been there as a ranch for a long time. Since it was the only thing in the area that indicated habitation, I will, for now, accept it as the possible site of the Suttle Post Office. Perhaps a search of historical property records would better identify where Andrew P. Suttle lived.

#### VERNE

I have found no mention of Verne in the historical literature of Delta County. Also, there is no Geographic Site Location Report in the Delta County file. This is not too surprising as the establishment was rescinded in less than three months.

I can speculate that it was a ranch or farm that would have served surrounding families and that it may have been judged unnecessary and quickly rescinded in the face of the expanding Rural Free Delivery system.

### WELCOME

Welcome is another of the Delta County post offices that have not been mentioned in the county's historical literature. However, there is a Geographic Site Location Report from which the site can be determined. I have also been fortunate enough to meet someone from the area that was knowledgeable about Welcome and confirmed the location I have spotted.

To get to the site of Welcome, start in Eckert and drive east on Delta County Road N. To the west (of Highway 65) this road is marked as leading to the county's sanitary landfill. Six and one-half miles east of Eckert turn north on County Road 2649 for a half-mile, then east on County Road N (once again). A half-mile further and you pass an older farmstead on the south side of the road. This was the site of the Welcome Post Office.

#### WELCOME – Continued

From what one can see of the surrounding countryside, this was another rural ranch post office that for a few short years served surrounding ranches and farms. It was likely another casualty of the expanding Rural Free Delivery system.

[SRM Note: Alternate directions that lead to the site of Welcome have been given to me by someone who had recently visited the site.]

To get to the site of Welcome, start in Eckert, which is an incorporated part of Delta County and has been absorbed by Orchard City. Go east on North Road about 6 miles, it is straight until you come to several gullies, including one big one called Madison Gulch. Keep the faith and stay on North Road as it wanders around. After you emerge from the Gulch, North Road straightens out. Go east until you hit 2640 Road, and turn left and go north about half a mile to a right turn only and it becomes North Road again. Go about a half mile on North Road, and on the south side of the road was the site of Welcome.


